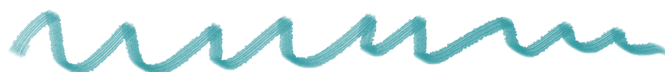
ELIZABETH GYSI... Abby

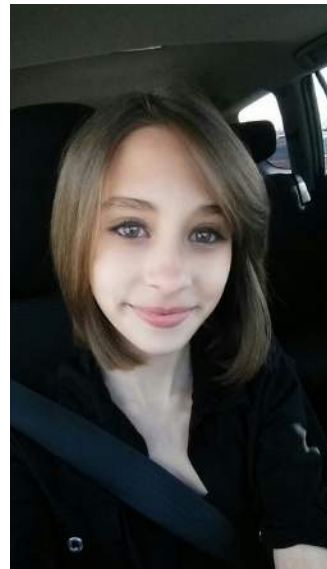


BENTLEY HILL... Brandon

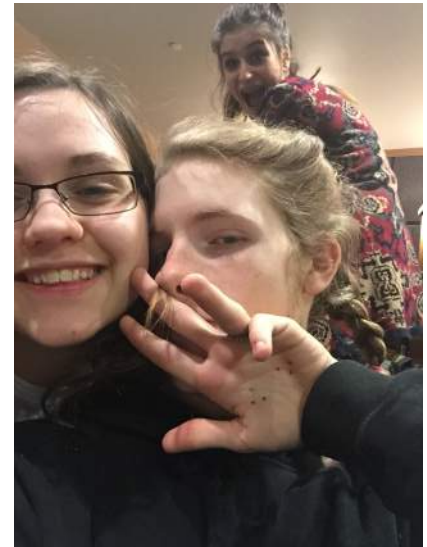
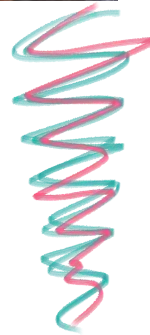
SIERRA YATES... Angela

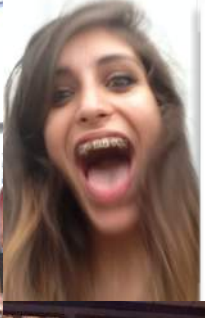
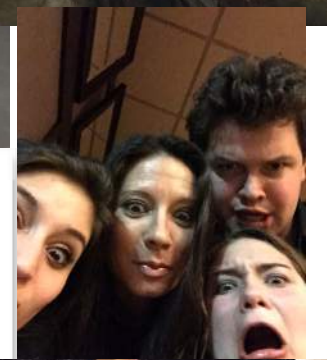
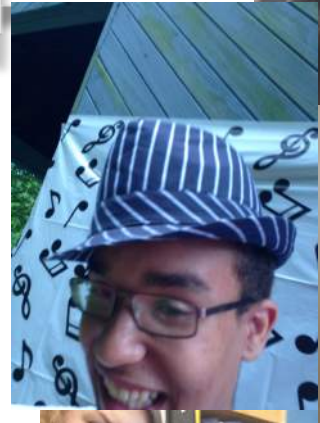
