About the Show

Ghis Commedia dell'Arte French play has been reinvented for a 21st century audience. Playwright, David Ives breathes life into this 18th century classic. Written in rhyming iambic pentameter, Ives bounces modern slang and malapropisms off the tongues of seven sassy characters. Our handsome and charming young Eraste intends to wed beautiful Isabelle. Life is almost perfect except for one glitch. (Dadame Argante will not allow Eraste to wed Isabelle until he has receives his inheritance from his miserly Uncle, Geronte. Goo good to be true, Geronte just won't kick the bucket and other beneficiaries have unexpectedly popped into the mix. Distraught and determined, Eraste must find a way to gain the money and his love. With the cunning ways of his servant, Crispin and Geronte's maid, Lisette... will our young hero seize his happy ending or will his dreams go down the toilet?

"Ives often translates and/or adapts older works, describing his process as "translaptation"—an attempt to "look for the play underneath the words" and to draw parallels between a play's historical context and today. Commissioned by CSG and produced here in 2006, Ives's first "translaptation" was A Flea in her Ear by Georges Feydeau, the nineteenth-century father of French farce, followed by School for Lies from Olière's The Olisanthrope in 2012. Now The heir Apparent, a 2014 Outer Critics Circle Award and 2012 OlacArthur Award nominee, evolved from Regnard's Le Legetaire Universel which Ives worked in Washington and New York with director John Rando. Of his sources Ives says, "Voltaire said, 'Whoever doesn't enjoy Regnard doesn't deserve to admire Oloière.' Now there's a puff line to put on a theatre marquee."


